

DEAR MILLENNIUM COMMUNITY,

It's our privilege to present the 2022-23 Annual Report. This report highlights the generosity of our community and celebrates Millennium's commitment to its mission and vision. This report will include program highlights and financial and philanthropic reporting for the 2022-23 school year.

The school year began with a return to normalcy. Without the pandemic's restrictions, Millennium was able to offer a high-quality student-centered education steeped in our focus on whole-self well-being. Students benefited from a Real World Program filled with expeditions and hands-on work in our community. True to Millennium, students routinely engaged in apprenticeships and workplace visits, community service activities, and spent time in nature. Quests dove deep into rich topics such as politics, poetry, environmental stewardship, computer science, learning theory, engineering, mindfulness, and much more. Projects, culminations, and capstones inspired students as they showcased deep and compassionate learning.

Millennium launched its Strategic Plan and successfully received a prestigious 7-year accreditation status by the California Association of Independent Schools. The visiting team of education leaders examined our school and praised our program's many unique qualities, rating our educational program and student experience as highly effective, the highest possible rating. We also hosted our first-ever Alumni Event, welcoming over 150 students and families back to Millennium.

Thanks to our fundraising efforts and careful stewardship of the school's finances, we dedicated approximately \$950,000 in financial assistance, provided top salaries and benefits to attract and retain the highest quality Guides, delivered on our commitment to professional development, and strengthened our mindfulness and social-emotional programs.

As an organization, Millennium also furthered its commitment to sharing its innovative developmental-science based methods of education with others. Approximately 40 parents joined our Forum program, and we continued to provide professional development to schools and educators across the US. We also established new partnerships that laid the foundation to deliver Forum and leadership workshops on whole-self education to 100+ school leaders.

Larger societal forces continued to impact our community, most notably the Bay Area's post-pandemic economic challenges. However, our community continued to navigate challenges in true Millennium fashion: with compassion, wisdom, purpose. We want to extend special thanks to our incredibly talented group of faculty, staff, and board members, whose energy, passion, and creativity were instrumental in having a strong school year. In the end, we celebrated our seventh year of reimagining middle school and generated fresh inspiration to launch our next phase of strategic growth this Fall!

We are so grateful to all the families, foundations, and local organizations supporting Millennium School and Millennium Forum. The commitment is truly inspirational. On behalf of our community's outstanding students and educators, the Board of Trustees, and our colleagues... thank you.



Providing access to Millennium's program has been a priority since we opened our doors in 2016. We continue to demonstrate our firm dedication to flexible tuition. Amongst our peer group of San Francisco independent schools, we are proud to commit one of the highest percentages of our operational budget to our Flexible Tuition Program (20% in 2022–23). Through the generous gifts of families and local donors, we can offer assistance to our families each year, and we are immensely grateful to everyone who contributed to the Annual Fund.

Millennium provided financial assistance to 30% of our families in 2022-23, making our unique program more accessible in what we recognize is already one of the country's most expensive cities. Millennium strives to be a school representing the city of San Francisco found directly outside our school's walls: a city of different races and ethnicities, gender identities, socioeconomic positions, sexual orientations, cultures, religions, and nationalities, to name a few. Our flexible tuition program, while not a solution to the inequities that exist in our society, allows us to bridge the gap for many families.


In the 2022–23 academic year, our dedication to teacher professional development and retention was unwavering. We deeply value continuous learning and strive to provide abundant opportunities for our Guides to enhance their skills and knowledge.

Like our students, our Guides set personal goals to nurture their inner capacities, directly aligning them with their classroom aspirations. We dedicated meaningful time to ongoing observations, peer partnerships, and professional development to support each of our talented Guides in pursuing these goals.

Millennium School understands the diverse needs of our students, which is why we place great importance on in-house professional development. This work has allowed us to better serve students with learning differences, like dyslexia and hearing loss. By equipping our Guides with specialized knowledge and techniques, we ensured that every student received the necessary support to academically and personally thrive. Moreover, our school fostered a strong sense of community through our Forum program, where Guides actively engaged in regular discussions and shared their experiences. This close-knit community allowed them to develop their own Whole-self Skills, enabling our educators to become exemplary models and coaches for students.

Professional learning continued over the summer. Several of our Guides participated in Columbia University's Reading and Writers Workshop. One of our STEM Guides attended a three-day workshop at the Conservation Institute in San Diego, which explored the fascinating field of environmental conservation. Several Guides attended JEDI-themed training, such as those offered by AmplifyRJ. Additionally, several Guides participated in the Mindful School professional development workshop, equipping them with effective strategies to foster mindfulness and well-being among our students.

While we bid farewell to some valued staff members, we are excited to welcome two new Humanities Guides this summer. Their extensive expertise in literacy, history, writing, and Socratic seminars will further enrich the school's knowledge base and community. This expansion of expertise will enhance our students' learning experiences, broadening their horizons and fostering their intellectual growth.



Millennium doesn't just practice mindfulness; we embody it. We consider ourselves a community of mindful practice for students, staff, and parents. Mindfulness practices have been scientifically proven to support attention, emotional regulation, and compassion. By practicing mindfulness as a community, we are exercising the capacities necessary for healthy development and creating a happy and conscious school culture.

To fulfill this goal, we practice mindfulness with students at every morning meeting, throughout the day in classes, and in an introductory mindfulness quest for all incoming 6th graders. We also know that the most significant way to teach mindfulness is by Guides and parents embodying these qualities in the way we show up with our students. We have extensive mindfulness professional development training for our Guides.

We also are committed to bringing these mindfulness teachings to the wider world. We will continue offering free speaker series to all parents and educators. We aim to support other schools in integrating mindfulness. Lastly, we also incorporate mindfulness practices in our delivery of councils, real-world programming, and Quests to enable students to understand how being mindful can help them to support the greater good.

Many schools think of programming in two parts - academic and social-emotional. At Millennium, we utilize a Whole-Self Learning approach that centers all aspects of self: our spirit (be), heart (feel), mind (think), and body (do). Whole-Self Learning is at the core of all the work we do within the community. We work intentionally daily to create a safe space where students are empowered to understand and show up as their authentic selves. You see this in our robust advisory program, which includes Forum and grade-level Councils, and our Real World program. These core parts of our school allow students to learn about and engage in practices and immersive, communal experiences that ignite self-awareness and purpose.

At Millennium, we know that prioritizing a student's well-being is a prerequisite to engagement in enriching learning experiences. To that end, Whole-Self Learning guides our delivery of social-emotional learning and our approach to behavior management. We practice a restorative justice approach that keeps relationships, well-being, and community at the center of our work. We teach students conflict resolution through our Clearing model, group circles, or other restorative conversations.

The continued development of this unique middle school environment requires our staff to regularly create curricula, engage in professional development, and utilize the support of experts. This work is made possible through the generous support of our Annual Fund.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING







True to our mission to share our methods with others, Millennium continued to impact communities beyond the school.

Over the 2022-23 school year, Millennium continued to provide Forum for Educators across the U.S. This program has proven to be a valuable resource to bolster the well-being of teachers by reducing anxiety and burnout through these challenging times. The program demonstrates that consistent practice improves self-care, well-being, supportive professional relationships, embodied social-emotional skills, and mindfulness practices.

In pursuit of a more effective whole-school model, Millennium launched Forum for Parents, creating cohorts of parents that met throughout the year to further their personal well-being practices and support each other. Alongside our parent education series, "Being Well, Parenting Well," these groups gained valuable skills while discussing the realities of parenting today.

Millennium aspirations are large. This year, we laid the foundation to grow our impact across communities. We aim to increase our outreach to parents across the Bay Area by expanding our Parent Education and Parent Forum programs. We are training school groups on our whole-self-education methods and will welcome approximately 120 Heads of School into our programs this fall. We are also introducing Millenium Forum across an entire public school district and other independent schools. Overall, we will indirectly impact thousands of students in S.F. and across the U.S.

We are grateful for the generosity of the foundations and individuals enabling us to provide whole-self development to educators and parents. We are honored to be doing this work with you.


